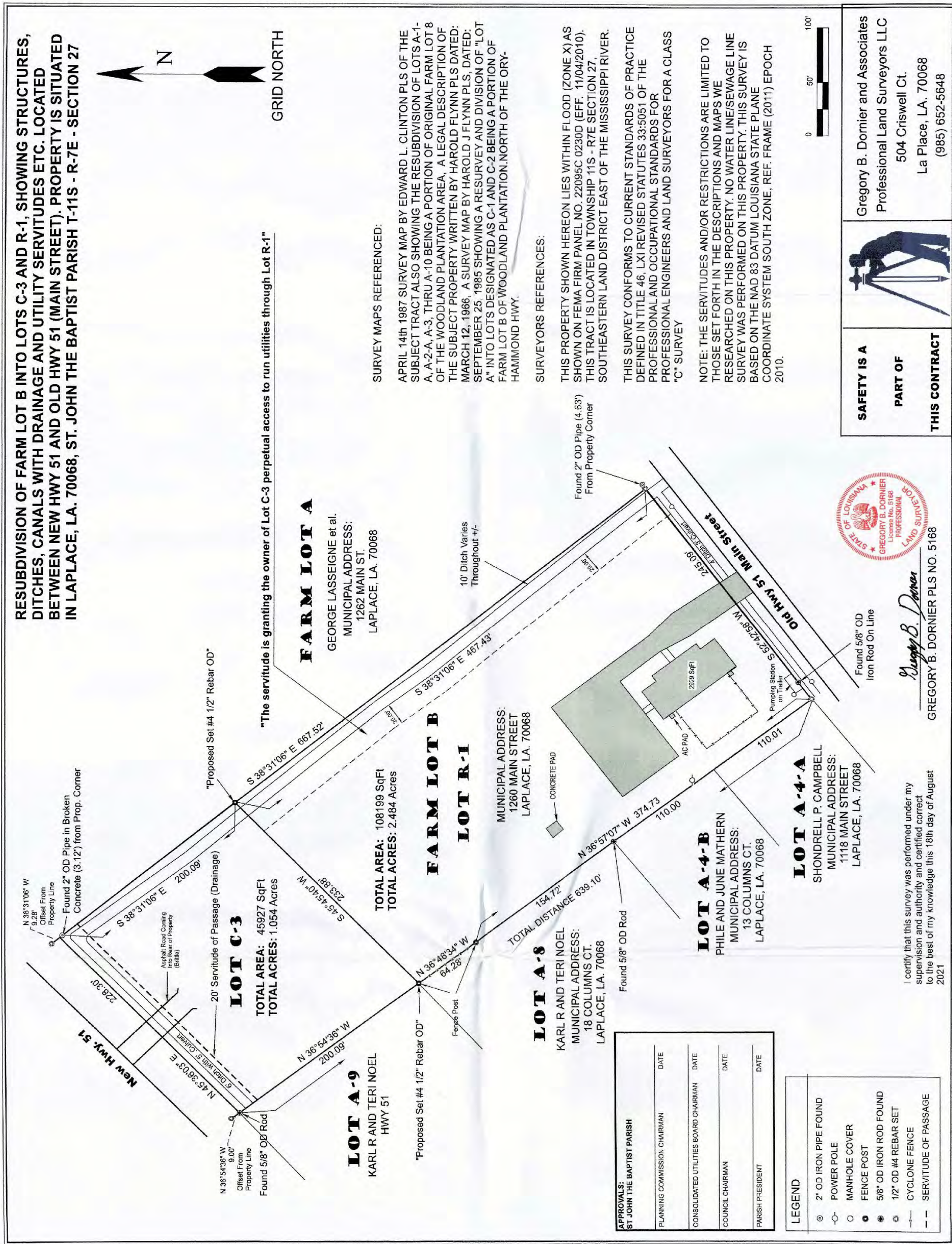

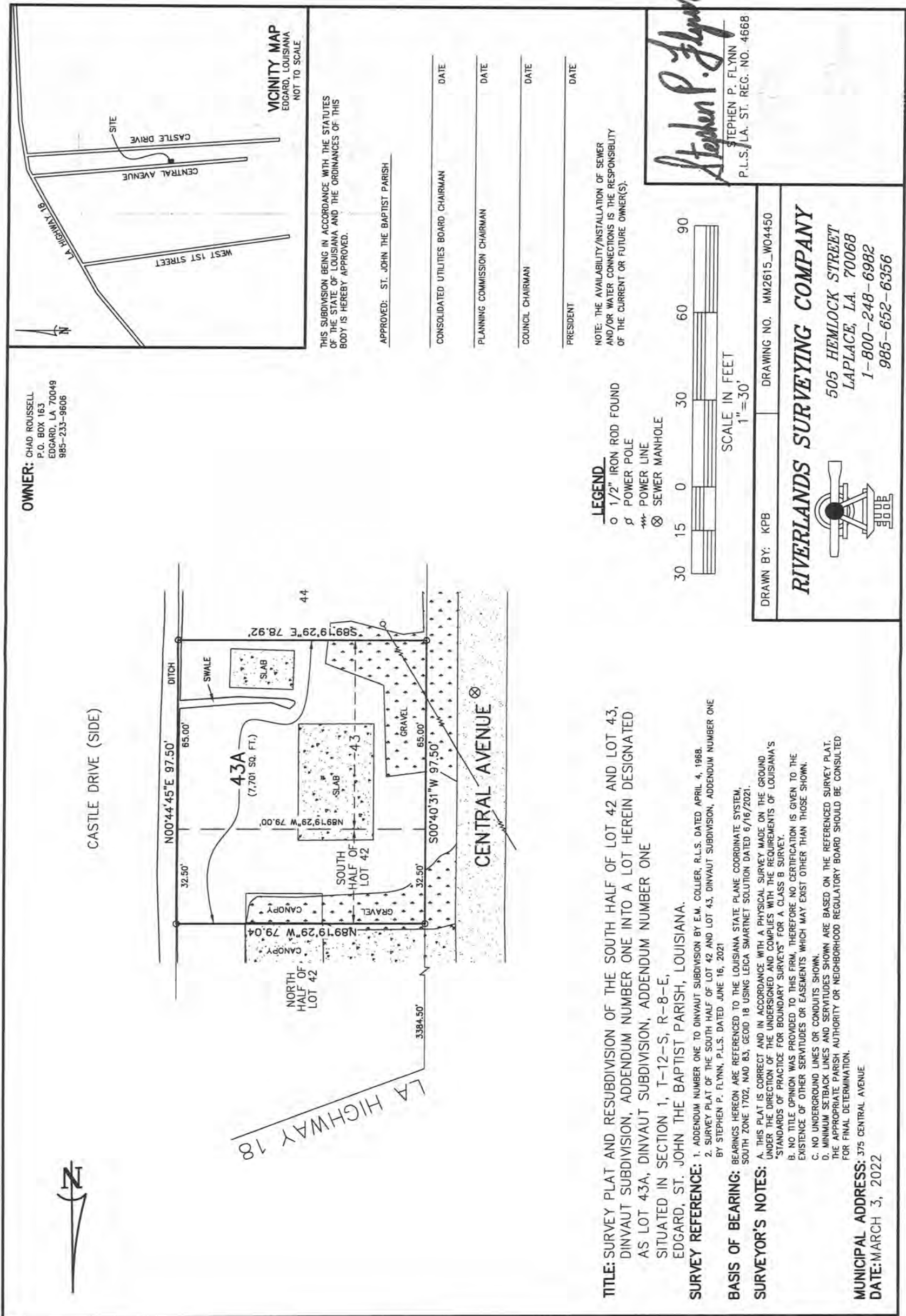

A Resolution in support of: (1) declaring the week of May 1<sup>st</sup> through May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022, “National Hurricane Preparedness Week”; (2) encouraging citizens of St. John to purchase flood insurance; (3) stressing the requirement to obtain building permits in advance of construction in the floodplain; and (4) emphasizing the importance of making improvements to individual Hurricane Preparedness Plans: all of which may better reduce the occurrence of death and injury as a result of severe flooding during the 2022 Hurricane Season. **WHEREAS**, Article IV, Section H (2) and (5) of the St. John the Baptist Parish Home Rule Charter permits the Parish Council to adopt a resolution when authorizing a designated person(s) to execute a previously approved contract on its behalf and/or to perform a ministerial act related to the administrative business of the Parish; and, **WHEREAS**, floods can happen anytime, anywhere, and without warning; and, **WHEREAS**, flooding has the potential to create significant emergencies for the citizens of St. John the Baptist Parish, including risks of imminent threat to life and property, and hundreds of millions of dollars in damage to homes, businesses and local government infrastructure; and, **WHEREAS**, the State of Louisiana has received thirty-two (32) Presidential Disaster Declarations for flooding since 2000, and is among the top ten (10) states with the most natural disasters; and, **WHEREAS**, flood damage is not typically covered under a standard homeowner’s insurance policy and usually takes 30 days to activate, so residents are encouraged to review their flood risk and purchase flood insurance to protect and insure their property from flood and associated damages; and, **WHEREAS**, the National Weather Service has named the week of, May 1<sup>st</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup>, as the 2022 National Hurricane Preparedness Week; and, **WHEREAS**, the National Weather Service has declared June 1<sup>st</sup> as the start and November 30<sup>th</sup> as the end of the 2022 Hurricane Season; and, **WHEREAS**, the public is well informed of the dangers associated with flooding; and can make improvements to its preparedness to reduce the occurrence of death and injury as a result of severe flooding. **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: SECTION I.** To declare the week of May 1<sup>st</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022, “Hurricane Preparedness Week.” **SECTION II.** To encourage citizens of St. John to purchase flood insurance. **SECTION III.** To stress the requirement to obtain building permits in advance of construction in the floodplain. **SECTION VI.** To emphasize the importance of making improvements to individual hurricane preparedness plans, all of which may better reduce the occurrence of death and injury as a result of severe flooding during the 2022 Hurricane Season. The motion passed with Councilwoman Duhe-Griffin absent.
