> ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST PARISH COUNCIL STATE OF LOUISIANA **ORDINANCE NO. 23-08**

THE ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS; THAT SECTIONS 2-20 and 2-21 OF CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE II ESTABLISH-ING THE COMPOSITION AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE PAR-COUNCIL; CREATING ELECTION DISTRICTS ISH AND PRECINCTS, AND THE DESIGNATION OF POLLING PLACES HEREBY AMENDED TO PROVIDE FOR DISTRICT PRECINCT BOUNDARY DE SCRIPTIONS AND POLLING PLACES ALL IN ACCORANCE WITH THE 2023 ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST PARISH REDIS-FRICTING PLAN.

WHEREAS, as specified in Louisiana Revised Statutes 33:1411 the Saint John the Baptist Parish Council is required to examine and if necessary redraw the boundaries of the voting districts every ten (10) years in accordance with the decennial census; and,

WHEREAS, the Census was taken in 2020, and the popula-tion data was released by the Census Bureau in August of 2021; and,

WHEREAS, the Saint John the Baptist Parish Council has examined, reviewed, and considered various alternative alignments based upon the findings of the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of

the Census; and, WHEREAS, the Saint John the Baptist Parish Council has selected the considered map alignments entitled Alternative 1

and Alternative A; now NOW THEREFORE BE IT OR-DAINED by the St. John the Baptist Parish Council, that SECTION 1. Sections 2-20 and 2-21 of Chapter 2, Article II of the St. John the Baptist Parish Code of Ordinances be hereby amended as follows:

ST. JAMES PARISH – DG Fuels, an emerging leader in cellulosic dropin sustainable aviation fuel (SAF), announced it has secured an option for and is evaluating a 3,000-acre site in St. James Parish as the potential location of a new low-emission fuel manufacturing facility.

The proposed \$3.1 billion investment would create 1,055 new direct jobs with an estimated average annual salary exceeding \$72,000. Louisiana Economic Development estimates the project would result in 5,231 new indirect jobs, for a total of 6,286 potential new jobs in the Southeast Region.
